Each year during the first weekend in May, the Association sponsors Alumni Weekend. During this weekend we assemble to commemorate and celebrate the contributions made by this institution of learning to our city, state, nation and world. Additionally, we acknowledge the thousands of Alumni who were the beneficiaries of the priceless and indispensable gifts of knowledge, skill and values that they acquired while attending the Historic Frederick Douglass

High School.

Our celebration begins with Alumni Day on Friday (May 3, 2019) that is inclusive of a Program and a delicious Luncheon for the Alumni and friends. We culminate the weekend on Sunday (May 5, 2019) with the Alumni worshipping together at a local house of faith.

Each year we select a Keynote Speaker for Alumni Day whose life exemplifies the motto of our school, "Pride, Dignity and Excellence" and one who will deliver a motivating informative expository message. The Theme this year is *"Lest We Forget: It Is A New Day"*.

Our keynote speaker for Alumni Day 2019 is Richard T. Adams a native of Baltimore and a graduate of the Historic Frederick Douglass High School in the Class of February 1950. After graduation he entered the United States Coast Guard serving his active tour of duty during the Korean Conflict. He served with valor and received distinguished commendations. After the Coast Guard, Adams returned to Baltimore focused on completing his education. He attended Morgan State University earning a Bachelor of Science Degree, professional certification in Speech Audiology and Pathology from the University of Iowa and a Master's of Science Degree from the University of Maryland. Entering a field of Speech and Audiology, he was often the only African American in the workplace at a time when racial inequality was the norm in our nation, yet this did not prevent him from forging ahead and excelling. He served in a variety of leadership positions in the field of Speech and Hearing as well as administration in both state and federal agencies. He taught at Howard University School of Communication and Coppin State College in Baltimore.

In 1970, Richard T. Adams accepted the call to the ministry attending Howard University School of Religion. Ordained in 1977, Reverend Adams has served as an associate minister or assistant pastor at six churches and as Interim Director of the Morgan State University Christian Center. He is currently the Assistant Pastor of Provident Baptist Church in Baltimore.

Rev. Adams is a life member of the National Education Association, the Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, Beta Sigma Taw and the Historic Frederick Douglass High School Alumni Association. He has served in leadership in many organizations and has been the recipient of many prestigious awards and honors. He has been a member of the Association for the Study of African American Life and History for over 30 years and served as Vice President of Membership. In 2009 Rev. Adams received the Honorary Doctor of Humane Letters Degree from the Eastern Theological Seminary in Lynchburg, Virginia.

Rev. Dr Adams and his wife Judith Jackson Adams have two sons and two grandsons. We are honored to have this innovative, dedicated, change-agent and torch bearer as our Keynote Speaker for Alumni Day 2019.
