MESSAGE FROM THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS





The Frederick Douglass High School Media Center was beautifully decorated in holiday colors adorned with a skillfully trimmed Christmas Tree. GIVING BACK TO THE HISTORIC FREDERICK DOUGLASS HIGH SCHOOL



Attorney William A. Dorsey, Esq. was a member of the graduating Class of June 1956 of the HFDHS. After graduating, Mr. Dorsey used the knowledge, skills and educational ethics that he acquired as a student at the Historic Frederick Douglass High School to propel himself through college and law school. His willingness to work hard and use the motto of Douglass High School, "*Pride, Dignity and Excellence*" as an incentive, enabled him to become a "*Legal Icon*".

In 1970, Mr. Dorsey was admitted to the University of Maryland Law School. As a law student, he was hired by Judge R. Hargrove, Sr. (another Douglass Alumni) to work as a court Commissioner. After graduation, he rose to the position of Chief Administrative Clerk for the District Court for Baltimore City. Chief Administrator, William Dorsey, was also instrumental in planning for the Edward F. Borgerding Courthouse on Wabash Avenue. The new courthouse location became the Baltimore City District Court headquarters.

Attorney William Dorsey retired from the District Court in 1979 and eventually opened his own law office at the corner of Hilton Street and Liberty Heights Avenue where he has been in private practice of law to the present. Ever committed to Frederick Douglass, Dorsey currently serves as the legal counsel for the Historic Frederick Douglass High School Alumni Association.

On May 17, 2018 William A. Dorsey, Esq., was awarded the "Inaugural Legal Legacy Award" at the Thurgood Marshall Day Legal Legacy Dinner. In a stirring and motivating discourse that attributed his success to the educational foundation laid at Douglass High School, Mr. Dorsey donated \$5000.00 to the Historic Frederick Douglass High School Alumni Association, Inc. to establish a fund to assist and motivate Douglass High students in need.

On December 13, 2018 at the HFDHSAA's Annual Holiday Celebration Mr. Dorsey gave an inspiring and motivating challenge to all Alumni of Douglass to contribute to the abovementioned fund and keep our motto of, "Pride, Dignity and Excellence" alive for our students.
