This week WMAR NEWS VETEREANS SPOTLIGHY honored **William Brent** of Baltimore, who enlisted in the United States Army shortly after graduating from Frederick Douglass High School in 1940.

Brent served during World War II and went on to receive a bachelor's degree from Morgan State University, where he ran track and was a trainer of the football team. After college, Brent began what would be a 37-year career in government service. He worked at the U.S. Department of the Army at the Army Chemical Center, Fort Holabird, Army Intelligence Corps and, ultimately, retired as a Sports Director at Fort Meade. Brent has also given back so much to the community. He served on the city's first civilian review board for 15 years and is a longtime member of St. Johns AME. In 2017, he was named the Meals on Wheels of Central Maryland Volunteer of the Year. This past January, he received the prestigious Howard L. Cornish Community Service Award from Morgan State University. In July 2020 Mr. Brent celebrated his 96th Birthday. HATS OFF AND KDOS!!!
